- \$55 per weekend two adults (includes parking)
- \$20 per night single adult + \$5 parking
- Additional \$10 per child age 13-17 - MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT
- Kids 12 and under camp free - MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT
- Camping is provided for free to Festival Volunteers only

This campground is suitable for tents, vans, and RV's. Toilets are provided. A footbridge connects the campground to the Festival Site, and vehicle entrance is located off Seymour Road (200m north of the campground). Ask for details at the Festival Main Gate. Campsites are on a first-come, first serve basis.

Welcome to the Starbelly Jam Music Festival Campground

Camping with your Starbelly Jam Music Festival community is a wonderful, freeing, expressive experience that often feels like an escape from reality, but it's important to keep your wits about you. Be good to yourself and those around you. Continue the Starbelly Jam tradition of being respectful, caring, kind and gentle with your camping community. Camp near your friends, mark your property and your tent, and take your valuables with you each time you leave. If you aren't camped near your friends, make new friends with your neighbours!

Event Staff and Professional Security patrol the campgrounds and are there to facilitate a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone. Please assist them by following their instructions when asked to do so. If you have any safety or security concerns, go to either campground entrance where you will find the Festival Campground Managers and/or Professional Security. **In the event of a life-threatening emergency, call 911 first.**

It is not our mission to police your lifestyle or inhibit self-expression. Law enforcement officers at the Festival are simply fulfilling the same function as the police in any community - helping to ensure safe homes in safe communities. It is their duty to respond to any infraction of the law that is in plain view or is brought to their attention. Please respect the valuable work that they do to keep everyone in our Festival community safe.

Camping Options

The Starbelly Jam Music Festival Campground offers primitive camping adjacent to the Festival Site. There is a General Camping area and a Family Friendly (Quiet) Zone. Both areas are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. The Family Friendly(Quiet) Zone is intended to create a gentle, mellow space for our families and other campers who don't do the "full on, all-night-jamming-till-the-sun-comes-up" kind of festing. Please keep in mind that the campground will have hundreds of campers - Starbelly Jam Music Festival can make no guarantee of a totally quiet and peaceful night's sleep. Remember to bring ear plugs - a cheap and simple solution for all ages.

Campground No-Nos

- Firework, fire sticks or fire batons
- Campfires
- Glass (this includes beer and liquor bottles)
- No open consumption of alcohol on campground paths or roadways - campsite only
- Burning or collecting scavenged wood
- Pets
- Loud or amplified music
- Drum kits
- Unauthorized distribution of printed materials
- Unauthorized commercial vending
- Illegal drugs
- Unauthorized generators

This is a LEAVE NO TRACE event. You are responsible for packing out everything you bring in. Campsites must be maintained and kept clean. Anything that significantly alters the campsites (eg. digging holes, using lumber) must be pre-approved by the campground management.

Safety and Security

Starbelly Jam Music Festival prioritizes the health, safety and security of our patrons, guests, staff and volunteers above all else. Our participation in good health and safety practices is of paramount importance: however, we all have a responsibility and a role in helping to ensure both our personal and collective safety.

The Starbelly Jam Music Festival does not promote or condone the use of illegal drugs, excessive alcohol use, or underage drinking. The Festival works with law enforcement officers to patrol the Festival and all campgrounds.

Starbelly Jam Music Festival reserves the right to refuse entry to the Campground and/or the Festival Site to patrons and/or volunteers who demonstrate aggression or intoxication. Removal of persons from the Site or Campground will be done lawfully, in conjunction with Festival Security Policy and/or with assistance from the RCMP.

Participant Responsibilities

Everyone has a fun, relaxed time when they know what to expect. Here are some of the really important things to know as a Starbelly Jam Music Festival attendee:

Your presence at the Festival Site, Festival Campground and/or the Quiet Campground signifies your agreement to the Festival rules. Failure to comply with any of these guidelines is grounds for eviction without refund.

In the Quiet and Festival Campgrounds, anyone age 16 years or younger must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or guardian, with a limit of four (4) minors per adult. The parent or guardian will be held solely responsible for the actions of the minors under his/her care. We reserve the right to ask for proof of age.

The Starbelly Jam Music Festival does not allow and may confiscate: household furniture, amplified music, drum kits, unauthorized generators, glass, pets, anything commercially vended, illegal drugs, binge drinking devices, firearms/weapons, fireworks and other explosives.

You must bring sufficient resources (food, money, shelter, clothing/footwear) for your entire stay

Wristbands must be worn at all times and shown for entry into either the Starbelly Jam Music Festival Site or Campgrounds. Wristbands are non-transferable, non-exchangeable, and non-replaceable. If you remove, stretch or tamper with your wristband in any way, you will not be allowed entry.

Open alcohol is not allowed in the Festival Site or Parking Areas, nor on trails, roads, or anywhere outside the Campgrounds. Disorderly conduct, drunkenness, illegal drugs, obscene or abusive language, failure to follow directions from Starbelly Jam Music Festival staff, and/or crude or rowdy behaviour will not be tolerated and may result in immediate eviction without a refund.

Starbelly Jam Music Festival will not be held responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items left in your campsite.

General Info

Minors (17 years and younger) must be accompanied by an adult, to a limit of four (4) minors per adult. If you are a guardian of an underage camper, you must be with them in order for them to receive their campground wristband.

And remember: You're responsible for them for the duration of the Festival.

Un-serviced Campsites

The Quiet and General Festival Campgrounds have porta-potties and recycling/waste centers. There is a drinking water station near the Main Campground Vehicle Entrance.

No fires are permitted anywhere in the Campground.

RV's

RV's are only permitted in the General Festival Campground, however all RV's in the Festival Campground must have a RV Vehicle Ticket, as space for RV's is limited.

No Reservations

Campsites cannot be reserved. If you want to camp with a group of friends, plan to arrive together to ensure you get spots together.

Leave No Trace

We operate by the "Leave No Trace" principle. Pack out what you pack in to your campsite and be sure to keep your site clean and tidy for the duration of the Festival.

First Aid

For all injuries or medical situations during festival hours, go to the **Festival First Aid Post behind the main park pavilion**. Fully-qualified first aid attendants are on site Friday morning through Monday take-down.

For injuries or medical situation in the Campgrounds after festival hours, go to either campground entrance where Professional Security and/or the Night Manager will assist you.
