- \$90 adult weekend campground admission
- \$120 family weekend campground admission (two adults, two children)
- \$15 per extra child weekend campground admission- MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT
- \$30 adult one night campground admission
- \$40 family one night campground admission (two adults, two children)
- \$5 per extra child one night campground admission- MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT
- Camping is half price for Festival Volunteers

This campground is suitable for tents, vans, and RV's. Toilets are provided. A footbridge connects the campground to the Festival Site, and vehicle entrance is located off Seymour Road (200m north of the campground). Ask for details at the Festival Main Gate. Campsites are on a first-come, first serve basis.

Camping Options

Starbelly Jam Music Festival offers primitive camping next to our festival site. We have a General Camping area and a Family Friendly Zone that offers a dedicated area for campers who want to camp in a quieter area. This area is available on a first come first serve basis and is intended to create a gentle mellow space for our families and other campers who don't do the full on all night jammin' till the sun comes up. Please keep in mind that this is a campground with hundreds of campers. Starbelly Jam Music Festival can make no guarantees regarding a totally quiet and peaceful night's sleep. Please remember to bring ear plugs....a cheap and easy solution for all ages.

Participant Responsibilities

Everyone has a fun, relaxed time when they know what to expect. Here are some of the really important things we need you to know as a Starbelly Jam Music Festival participant. Your presence at the Starbelly Jam Music Festival and the Festival Campground signifies your agreement to these rules. Failure to comply with any of these guidelines is grounds for eviction without refund.

- In the Family and General Festival Campground, anyone aged 17 years or younger must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or guardian, with a limit of four minors per adult, who will be held solely responsible for the actions of the minors under his/her care. We reserve the right to ask for proof of age.
- The Starbelly Jam Music Festival does not allow and may confiscate: household furniture, amplified music, drum kits, unauthorized generators, glass, pets, anything for commercial vending, illegal drugs, binge drinking devices, firearms/weapons, fireworks and other explosives.
- You must bring sufficient resources (i.e. food, money, shelter, clothing/footwear) for your entire stay.
- Wristbands must be worn at all times and shown for entry into Starbelly Jam Music Festival campgrounds and the Festival site. Wristbands are non-transferable, non-exchangeable and cannot be replaced. If you remove, stretch or tamper with your wristband in any way, you will not be allowed entry.
- Open alcohol is not allowed in the festival event site, parking lots, on trails, roads or anywhere outside your campsite. Disorderly conduct, drunkenness, illegal drugs, obscene or abusive language, failure to follow directions from Starbelly Jam Music Festival Staff, and/or crude or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and may result in immediate eviction without a refund.
- Starbelly Jam Music Festival will not be responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items left in your campsite



General Info

Campers must have a festival wristband to get a campground wristband.

If you don't have a festival wristband you will be asked to leave. Get your festival wristband at the festival's main gate. There will be staff there to assist you starting at 12 noon on Friday the 28th.

Minors (17 years and younger) must be accompanied by an adult, to a limit of four (4) minors per adult. If you are a guardian of an underage camper, you must be with them in order for them to receive their campground wristband.

And remember: You're responsible for them for the duration of the Festival.

No dogs or pets permitted in the campground or festival site.

We love pets, but please leave yours at home.

Un-serviced Campsites

The Quiet and General Festival Campgrounds have porta-potties and recycling/waste centers. There is non potable water available on site. Drinking water is available on the festival grounds.

No fires are permitted anywhere in the Campground.

RV's

RV's are only permitted in the General Festival Campground. No hook ups or sani-dumps available.

No Reservations

Campsites cannot be reserved. If you want to camp with a group of friends, plan to arrive together to ensure you get spots together.

Leave No Trace

We operate by the "Leave No Trace" principle. Pack out what you pack into your campsite and be sure to keep your site clean and tidy for the duration of the Festival. In an effort to reduce use of plastic water bottles we provide free safe & delicious drinking water on the festival grounds.. Be sure to bring a water bottle (no glass).

First Aid

For all injuries or medical situations during festival hours, go to the **Festival First Aid Post behind the main park pavilion.** Fully-qualified first aid attendants are on site Friday morning through Monday take-down.

For injuries or medical situations in the Campgrounds after festival hours, go to either campground entrance where Professional Security and/or the Night Manager will assist you.

For emergencies where the injured persons are unconscious, do not move them unless there is risk of life or limb. Stay with the person and send some to First Aid or Security for help. Have that person return to let you know the situation has been reported. Fully qualified First Aid Attendants will be dispatched to your location. In all

cases, explain the nature of the emergency and whether the person is conscious. The festival's First Aid Attendants are equipped to manage most medical emergencies. If you have any doubt regarding an injury or medical need **CALL 911**

Safety and Security

Event Staff and Professional Security patrol the campgrounds and are there to facilitate a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone. Please assist them by following their instructions when asked to do so. If you have any safety or security concerns, go to either campground entrance where you will find the Festival Campground Managers and/or Professional Security. **In the event of a life-threatening emergency, call 911 first.**

It is not our mission to police your lifestyle or inhibit self-expression. Law enforcement officers at the Festival are simply fulfilling the same function as the police in any community - helping to ensure safe homes in safe communities. It is their duty to respond to any infraction of the law that is in plain view or is brought to their attention. Please respect the valuable work that they do to keep everyone in our Festival community safe.

Starbelly Jam Music Festival prioritizes the health, safety and security of our patrons, guests, staff and volunteers above all else. Our participation in good health and safety practices is of paramount importance: however, we all have a responsibility and a role in helping to ensure both our personal and collective safety.

The Starbelly Jam Music Festival does not promote or condone the use of illegal drugs, excessive alcohol use, or underage drinking. The Festival works with law enforcement officers to patrol the Festival and all campgrounds.

Starbelly Jam Music Festival reserves the right to refuse entry to the Campground and/or the Festival Site to patrons and/or volunteers who demonstrate aggression or intoxication. Removal of persons from the Site or Campground will be done lawfully, in conjunction with Festival Security Policy and/or with assistance from the RCMP.

In the event of a weather warning, the Festival Security Director will contact the Campground Management, who will relay the information to festival campers.

Campground No-Nos

- Firework, fire sticks or fire batons
- Campfires
- Glass (this includes beer and liquor bottles)
- No open consumption of alcohol on campground paths or roadways - campsite only
- Burning or collecting scavenged wood
- Pets
- Loud or amplified music
- Drum kits
- Unauthorized distribution of printed materials
- Unauthorized commercial vending
- Illegal drugs
- Unauthorized generators
