Campground Vehicle Entrance is located down Seymour St, off of Hwy 3A, right across from The Market grocery store

Camping Prices

-Camping for volunteers is half price!-

*Children/Youth pricing is considered 18 years and under.

Children/ youth must be accompanied by a guardian.

Bringing a Vehicle?

- If you want your car at your campsite, you'll need to buy a vehicle pass.
- RVs, trailers, and buses also need a pass.
- Family passes include one vehicle pass. If you are a family bringing an RV, you are required to purchase an Oversized Unit-Add On.
- Extra vehicles or cars you don't need at your site can be parked for free in the overflow lot.

Reminder:

If your gear is in a vehicle parked in overflow, make sure you bring something to help carry it to your campsite!

STARBELLY CAMPGROUND

Starbelly Jam offers **primitive camping** right beside the festival grounds, the perfect way to fully immerse yourself in the music, community, and creativity.


Important: Camping passes must be purchased at the **festival's front gate** if you haven't bought one online. Passes are **not sold at the campground**, so please make sure to arrange this before setting up your site.


Camping Options:

- **General Camping** for tents (Vehicle Pass must be obtained)
- **Large Vehicle Section** for RVs, trailers & buses (no hookups)
- **Quiet Zone** - While we can't promise silence (it's still a festival, after all!), this area encourages folks to **wind things down earlier at night** out of respect for families and light sleepers.



Tip: Earplugs are recommended — it's still a festival!

 A short walk across the footbridge connects the campground to the festival site. Please cross carefully, as the crosswalk isn't official.

 **No camping allowed at:** Crawford Bay Beach, Festival parking area, "Back 40" of the campground

Participant Responsibilities

Let's keep the good vibes going by respecting a few important rules:

- **Minors** must be with a parent or guardian at all times. Each adult can supervise up to 4 minors.
- **No-go items & activities:**
Drum kits, generators, glass, pets, fireworks, campfires, illegal drugs, binge-drinking gear, weapons, and more. *(Full list below.)*
- **Wristbands** must be worn at all times — no swapping or tampering.
- **Alcohol** is allowed at your campsite only. Open drinks elsewhere will get you booted.
- **No vehicle idling** — it's a fire and health risk.
- Starbelly Jam is **not responsible** for lost or stolen items. Lock up your valuables.

Water & Facilities

Potable drinking water is available inside the festival grounds, so be sure to bring a reusable water bottle to stay hydrated. Non-potable water is available at the campground for washing, but it's not safe for drinking. Fires are not permitted anywhere on site, and if you're a smoker, please keep a bucket of water nearby to help prevent accidental grass fires.

RV Camping

- RVs, trailers & buses welcome (with a pass).
 - No hookups or dump stations.
 - Limited shade — plan accordingly.
 - First-come, first-served.

Leave No Trace

We love this land, and we know you do too! Help protect it by packing out everything you bring in, keeping your campsite clean to avoid attracting wildlife, and using the recycling and garbage stations provided. Please stick to marked trails and do your part to reduce single-use plastics whenever possible. Together, we can keep Starbelly Jam beautiful for everyone, year after year!

First Aid & Safety

- On-site **First Aid Post** during festival hours (near main park pavilion).
- After hours: find **Security** or the **Night Manager** at campground entrances.
- For emergencies: **Call 911** and stay with the person until help arrives.

Event staff and security are here to help, so if you see something unsafe, speak up! If anyone causes harm or puts others at risk, they'll be asked to leave (with RCMP support if needed).

What to Bring

- Tickets, ID, earplugs
- Tent, sleeping bag, pillow
- Rope, tarps, campsite lighting
- Cooking gear, reusable dishes, earth-friendly soap
- Water, water bottle, garbage & recycling bags
- Camp chair, flashlight & batteries
- Sun protection, comfy clothes & dancing shoes
- Toiletries & personal medications
- Costumes, face paint, glow toys
- Backpack or fanny pack
- Spray bottle for hot days!

What Not to Bring

- Fireworks, explosives, fire props
- Propane fire pits
- Glass containers
- Pets
- Drum kits, amplified sound systems
- Unauthorized sales or printed materials
- Illegal drugs & binge-drinking gear
- Generators, drones, ATVs
- Weapons
- Hate speech or offensive symbols
- Indigenous headdresses

Weather & Updates

Festival management will monitor weather conditions and share any alerts with campers. Safety first!
